

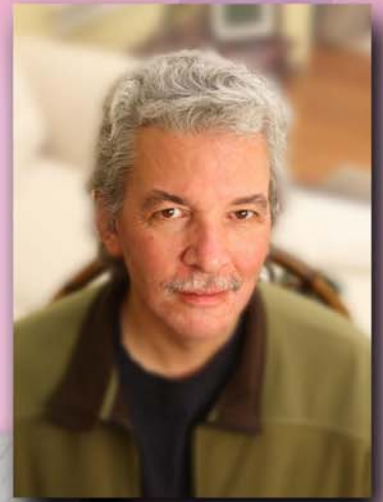
# ALBEMARLE HISTORICAL ROUNDTABLE

Marvin T. Jones and K. Paul Johnson will be discussing the book *Carolina Genesis: Beyond the Color Line* on Sunday, September 26, 2010 at 2:00 in the Museum's Gaither Auditorium.

The book is a collection of essays that examines mixed-heritage families and the racial obstacles they have overcome.



Marvin T. Jones is the Executive Director of the Chowan Discovery Group (CDG). The mission of the CDG is to research, document, preserve and present the 400+ year-old history of the landowning tri-racial people of color of the Winton Triangle, an area centered in Hertford County, North Carolina.

K. Paul Johnson is a retired public library director of Halifax, Virginia. Although a Norfolk native, Johnson's family migrated from the Albemarle region, specifically Okisko in Pasquotank County. His family's roots serve as the basis for his chapter in *Carolina Genesis*. He also published *Pell Mellers: Race and Memory in a Carolina Pocosin*, an exploration of Unionist loyalty in his father's Bertie County family during Civil War times. Johnson also authored three books published by State University of New York Press in the series *Western Esoteric Traditions*. In 2009 he became Corresponding Secretary of the Melungeon Heritage Association.
